Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Knights and Brothers All:

The "dog days of summer" are upon us and fall officially begins Thursday, September 23rd.

Soon the nights will turn chilly and the leaves will change. Meanwhile, back the ranch, you will find inside the proposed fraternal year 2010 – 2011 spending plan. Your Deputy Grand Knight and myself have sought to strike a balance between mandated expenses such as per capita

against discretionary expenses such as Casino night. Our first draft would have resulted in an approximate \$18,000 deficit. However, we sharpened our pencils, revisited pro-

posed activities and have reduced the deficit \$4,000 to \$14,000. Unfortunately, we still have a shortfall of revenue to proposed expenses.

We had as a goal this year to increase the number of fraternal and social activities to include a strong membership drive. Doing so requires holding events which in turn cost money. We sought to preserve the time honored functions like the Past Grand Knights dinner, cherished

activities such as brunch with Santa and to add new ones like the recent Kentucky Derby party.

The enclosed proposed spending plan is scheduled to be

voted on at the next regular business

meeting Monday, September 13th (moved due to Labor Day on the 6th). Please take time

to review the spending plan, think about those items you are willing to sacrifice and those

you believe must stay. And, plan to bring your constructive input to the business meeting on

September 13th, so we may approve council spending for the coming year.
