Chaplain's Report

Dear Brother and Sir Knights,

This month of April brings us to the remaining weeks of Lent. I would ask us to stop for a moment and evaluate how our Lent has been so far. Because we are in Cycle A of the Sunday Scripture readings, we have very rich material for reflection: the gospel of the Fourth Sunday is about the man born blind, that of the Fifth Sunday about the raising of Lazarus. Then we are at Palm Sunday, where we listen to the proclamation of the Passion. The gospel of the Fourth Sunday shows how this blind man gradually came to believe in Jesus. You will see this movement especially in the descriptions this man gave about Jesus. The raising of Lazarus, the gospel of the Fifth Sunday, will bring us to focus on the core belief of Christianity: the resurrection from the dead, of which Jesus is the prototype. The gospel of the Passion, this year according to Matthew, is interesting to note, particularly because each gospel's theology is shown in the way the passion story is portrayed - a

subject worthy of a Bible study in and of itself.

The culmination of our celebration is the Paschal Triduum, those intense days in which we follow through the liturgy the very last moments of Jesus' life of earth and celebrate with great joy his resurrection from the dead. Let us continue toward Easter in faith and prayer.

Between 2004 and 2010, five new state research programs pertaining to cell regeneration have been created. Each of the five programs includes a provision making it clear that no company can benefit from the program if it performs research on embryonic stem cells or aborted fetuses within Virginia's borders. However, the biotech industry has recently been engaged in an aggressive two-fold push: (1) for more lucrative state financial incentives, and (2) against restrictions supported by pro-life advocates on incentive-seeking companies that conduct life-destroying research. Given this activity, a state policy is needed more than ever to push back on behalf of Virginia taxpayers so that we are not forced to finance entities that conduct unethical, immoral, and destructive research. Financial Secretary News

Brother Knights, dues in our Council are due by December 31. If dues are not paid by that date, a second invoice for dues is sent to members owing dues. If dues are not paid after the second invoice, a Knight Alert letter and an Intent to Suspend letter will be sent to members in arrears. If dues are still not paid after the Intent to Suspend letter, a Letter of Suspension will be sent, advising the member that his membership has been suspended. Continued failure to pay dues may result in a member being dropped from the rolls of the Order.

For every member who is on the membership roll of Council 562 and who is not an Honorary Life Member, the Council is billed \$11.50 from the Supreme Council and from the State Council. Those funds are used to pay the expenses of the Supreme Council, including publication and delivery of Columbian Magazine and program initiatives on behalf of the State Council and Supreme Council. Thus, if a member does not pay his dues, Council 562 is required to expend funds without the benefit of the member's presence or contributing efforts.

Please pay your dues promptly to avoid the expense of invoicing you and removal from the rolls of our Order.

Established to commemorate the Life, Death, Dedication to Service and Love of God of Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield and to honor the Knights of Roanoke Council 562 whose efforts through the "Keep Christ in Christmas – Send Religious Cards" program have made these funds available.

An applicant, to be considered, must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child of a member provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death.

Decisions on approving scholarships are determined by the õScholarship Committeeö duly elected by the members of Council 562 in addition to the currently serving Grand Knight. Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community or church. All applications must be received by April 15th, 2011 and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicantøs most recent transcript showing classes taken and grades obtained. <u>Transcript does not have to be an official copy</u>. Applications received after the cut off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. Because of limited funds only ten \$500 scholarships can be awarded thus not all applications can be granted. The decisions of the committee are unanimous and final.
