## *Grand Knight's Report*

Brothers:

The following is an excerpt from an August 3 letter written by Cardinal Daniel N. DiNardo, Archbishop of Galveston-Houston and Chairman, Committee on Pro-Life Activities

"Dear Member of Congress:

One year ago, for the first time, the federal government announced that it would forbid Americans to provide or purchase health coverage unless it includes female surgical

sterilizations, all FDA-approved prescription drugs and devices for preventing pregnancy – including drugs and devices which can destroy a human life at its earliest stages – and "counseling and education" to promote these to all women and girls of childbearing age.

This unprecedented and misguided federal policy, ironically marketed as part of an effort to *expand* access to health coverage, began to take effect this week. Most of those who initiate or renew employee health plans as well as student plans at educational institutions after August 1 must comply with this mandate, notwithstanding their moral or religious objections, or drop their health coverage altogether as some colleges have now begun to do.

For our part, the Catholic bishops of the United States continue to advocate for life-affirming health care for all, especially for poor and vulnerable people. We do not see this policy as a step in that direction."

"As Catholics we are constantly called to live out our faith in our daily lives. In our charities, we comfort the sick, feed the hungry, care for the poor, and protect life. In the marketplace, our values guide us. We strive everywhere to practice what we preach."

## *Chaplain's Message*

Two years ago I went up to Washington DC for the Supreme Convention. Last month I flew with a brother Knight to be part of the 130<sup>th</sup> Supreme Convention in Anaheim California. Once again I am grateful to Roanoke and Fr. Maurice McDonald Councils and Roanoke Assembly for helping me defray much of the expenses. This time I renewed ties with some of the state chaplains I had met previously.

I came away from Anaheim with the realization that the Order is truly united with our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, in promoting the New Evangelization in the coming Year of Faith that begins on 11 October 2012 and ends on the Feast of Christ the King, 24 November 2013. I intend to make a presentation about this to our councils and assembly in one or more future meetings.

On September 14 we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. In Jesus' time, the cross symbolized shame; whoever hung on the cross was considered a criminal, perhaps one who incited rebellion against the Roman conquerors. Jesus humbled himself by his death on the cross, but God exalted him and lifted him up. This lifting up took place on the cross, as well as at his resurrection. And so for us Christians the cross is now the sign of our salvation. Let us reflect on the words of the Way of the Cross: "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, for by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."
