Supreme

There are numerous scholarships that Supreme either funds or is operating in trust. One of the key requirements of all of these scholarships is you must be about to start a catholic college or university. They are normally awarded to incoming freshmen and are renewed for a total of 4 years. Applications are available at <u>www.kofc.org</u> after Oct 1st and are due by March 1st. State

The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers need-based scholarships for Knights, their wives and widows of Knights who reside in Virginia at death. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing. Information can be found at <u>http://www.vakofc.org/scholastic-programs.html</u> and applications are accepted from Jan 1 – March 31.

Council

Our own Roanoke 562 Council has the Albert H. Canfield College Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, *must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child of a member* provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death.

Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community or church. All applications must be received by April 15th and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript (transcript does not have to be an official copy). Applications received after the cut-off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. Because of limited funds only ten \$500 scholarships can be awarded.Applications can be found at http://www.kofc562.org/canfield/
