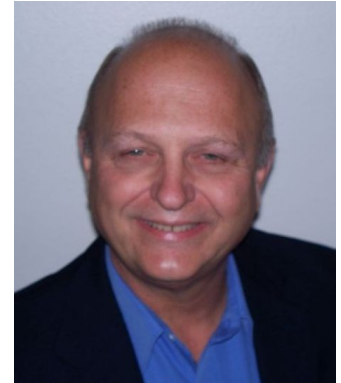

# Insurance Agent's Report.

## *What is going on with Long Term Care (LTC) right now.*

Brothers,

This month the US Government has approved an 83% increase on the LTC policies they offered to their employees and retirees. Metlife has stopped selling new policies as of July 1<sup>st</sup>.

The Knights of Columbus has actually doubled down on LTC. We came out with a new revised product with more benefits and we have never increased our rates historically. This is really for those who want to protect their assets and ensure their quality of care.

Also at the beginning of this year we have started to add a free LTC Rider to our Whole Life Insurance products once they reach a certain level. Many who don't qualify for LTC policies qualify for these and if you don't use it the death benefit stays with their families.

On another note I want to let everyone know the birth of the Moak Practice. I have already started by hiring my first employee and am currently looking at different office spaces to start out. We are starting to look at Life Planning over the old selling individual policies. Guaranteed family benefits and Guaranteed wealth generation is what we offer.
