

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT



Thanks to the Honorary Life Members for your continuing support and voluntary donations to the Council in support of our programs and for the building

The Financial Secretary has mailed the second notices for dues for those members who have not yet submitted their dues for the 2017 calendar year. First notices were sent out on December 16 and the second notices were sent out on January 17. If you have not received your notices for the payment of dues; we do not have your correct mailing address. Please contact us.

If you have not yet paid your dues please do so promptly, since duplicate notices are an expense we would like to avoid. If you are having financial issues or a disability preventing your payment of dues, please contact the Financial Secretary, Mike Lazzuri at 774-8482 or the Grand knight, John Krumpos at 960-1825 as we want to retain you if you want to belong to the Council.

If you do not want to continue in our Council you may wish to transfer to another Council rather than loose the benefits you and your family have as a Knight. If you wish to withdraw from the Knights of Columbus, you must do so in writing by sending us a dated note with your signature notifying us of your desire to withdraw. This is a Supreme Council requirement to remove you from the Council rolls. If you remain on the Council rolls without paying your dues, the Council must still continue to pay both Supreme and State per capita and fees for you from our charity funds.

Outstanding Young Man / Young Woman of the Year Awards

Each year the Virginia State Council of the Knights of Columbus names an Outstanding Young Man of the Year and an Outstanding Young Woman of the Year. The winners are selected from nominations submitted by the councils within Virginia.

The purpose of the program is to recognize the excellence of the young men and women of our communities and promote the recognition of their contribution within their community. Any young man or woman between the ages of 12 and 18 residing in Virginia is eligible to be nominated.

Supreme

There are a multitude of scholarships that Supreme either funds or is operating in trust. One of the key require-



ments of all of these scholarships is you must be about to start a catholic college or university. They are normally awarded to incoming freshmen and are renewed for a total of 4 years. Applications are available at www.kofc.org after Oct 1st and are due by March 1st.

State

The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers need-based scholarships for Knights, their wives and widows of Knights who reside in Virginia at death. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing. Our own Roanoke 562 Council has the Albert H. Canfield College Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, *must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child of a member* provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death.

Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community or church. All applications must be received by **April 15th** and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript showing classes taken and grades obtained. Transcript does not have to be an official copy. Applications received after the cut-off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. Because of limited funds only ten \$500 scholarships can be awarded. Applications can be found at http://www.kofc562.org/canfield/
