





#### Bingo Is Happening!

The Roanoke Council, in collaboration with the Fincastle Council, will begin hosting bingo on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month at Valley



Hall in Vinton, starting in March. That's right, only TWO Saturdays each month! Valley Hall is a SMOKE FREE facility, with an attached room for the smokers, which operates an afternoon and an evening bingo on Saturdays and Sundays. We will be hosting the Saturday afternoon bingo from 12:30 PM until 5:00 PM.

Valley has an established client base which has routinely generated an average session profit of about \$1,000. We fully expect to be netting \$1800 to \$2000 per month for our efforts! Currently, we have 32 volunteers and 9 subs who have signed up to help raise money for charity by working our Saturday afternoon bingos. With that many volunteers, no one is currently being scheduled to work more than every month and a half. Right now, Fincastle has more volunteers (19) than does Roanoke (13) and so now is projected to receive 59% of the net profits.

With our membership of 355, it is conceivable that no one would have to work more than ONCE a YEAR if all 355 members signed up to work one Saturday bingo each YEAR. And workers do not have to be members of the Knights of Columbus. In fact, working a Saturday bingo with your children or grandchildren (18+ yr.) would be a great way to bond with them while instilling the Christian value of charity in them! It would also be a great way to start a date night with your Lady! Of course, many Council members are not able to work even one bingo! But if you, or your Lady, can work even only one Saturday a year, you would help your Council gain a bigger share of the profits for our charities! So email me (john.krumpos@gmail.com) and tell me which Saturday(s) you can work during 2017. Remember, EVERY Saturday is IMPORTANT and any Saturday that you can volunteer is a huge help!

### **Council Dues**

It is that time of year when dues notices are sent out. If you have already sent your dues in, we all thank you! If you have not, please know that Supreme RE-QUIRES that notices be sent out



on certain dates. Each notice sent out costs the Council close to \$1.00! This is money we can't use for charity! So, please don't delay any longer.

Each and every member of our Council is cherished! And we never want a member to drop out of the order because of the dues. If you are not able to pay your dues, please call your Financial Secretary, Mike Lazzuri (540-774-8482) or your Grand Knight, John Krumpos (540-960-1825) to discuss options.

While we would be disheartened if any man decided he no longer wanted to belong to the Order, if you are such a man, we ask you to consider what not responding to your dues notice means. Your Council is taxed by both the Supreme and the States Councils for each member listed on our Council's membership list. This tax, and other fees also charged per member, amounts to about \$10 per year. If a listed member does not pay dues, this \$10 is paid out of the Council's charity funds!

Removing a member from the membership list is not easy! To remove you from our membership list, especially for failure to pay dues, the Council must prove that it has personally contacted you and discussed your dues. If you have not kept your Council advised of your change of address or phone number, we cannot contact you and Supreme will not readily let us suspend your membership. On the other hand, if you write a simple note saying you no longer want to be a Knight, sign and date it and return it to us, Supreme will remove your name from our membership role, we will not be paying the \$10 out of our charity fund, and we will not be troubling you in the future. Please think what good your \$10 could do!

# Knights of Columbus Scholarships

#### **Supreme**

There are a multitude of scholarships that Supreme either funds or is operating in trust. One of the key require-



ments of all of these scholarships is you must be about to start a catholic college or university. They are normally awarded to incoming freshmen and are renewed for a total of 4 years. Applications are available at <a href="https://www.kofc.org">www.kofc.org</a> after Oct 1<sup>st</sup> and are due by March 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **State**

The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers need-based scholarships for Knights, their wives and widows of Knights who reside in Virginia at death. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing. #### Council

Our own Roanoke 562 Council has the Albert H. Canfield College Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, *must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child of a member* provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death.

Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community or church. All applications must be received by **April 15th** and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript showing classes taken and grades obtained. Transcript does not have to be an official copy. Applications received after the cut-off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. 
# Home Repairs for a Family in Need
