

Grand Knight's Report

A proposed spending plan was presented at the July meeting, and has since been emailed to you for your consideration. We will discuss and vote on the proposed plan, and any amendments, at the August meeting.

While discussing the proposed spending plan, I stated that, since the Virginia Knights of Columbus State Conventions will be held in Roanoke next May, our fifth Casino Night would be postponed

from next spring until the fall as I did not think it advisable to split our resources between Casino Night and the State Convention. As a result, the proposed spending plan for the next fraternal year (July 1 to June 30) does not include income from a Casino Night, which significantly reduces the amount of money available for discretionary spending.

It has been suggested to me that since the Roanoke Council does not have primary responsibility for planning the Convention, we can indeed host a Casino Night in the spring without detracting from the State Convention. This would greatly increase the money available for more charitable programs. But we need a Brother to step up and take on the role of chairman for the next Casino Night since the previous chairman has decided to step down. Rest assured that many who made the first four Casino Night events successful are still willing to help.

Another item on the agenda for the August meeting is a proposal by the Board of Trustees to reinvest the assets of the Canfield Scholarship Endowment so as to generate the income necessary to fund the annual scholarships the Council awards. Your input is requested and we sincerely hope that you will attend our next meeting!

Venerable Fr. Michael J McGivney

In August, we remember our beloved founder, Fr. Michael J McGivney (August 12, 1852 – August 14, 1890). Fr. McGivney had a vision; On March 29, 1882, at Saint Mary's Church in New Haven, CT, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, with a small group of parishioners, as a mutual aid society, to provide financial assistance in the event of the men's death to their widows and orphans.

On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing McGivney's heroic virtue, thus declaring him "Venerable."

A miracle attributed to McGivney's intercession is under investigation at the Vatican. If canonized, he would be the first American-born priest to gain that recognition.
