Thanks from CHMRV

The Catholic Historical Museum would like to thank everyone who came to Montano's last Tuesday to support the museum. We had a great turnout and we do appreciate your support.

Our next activity will be our 2nd annual Spaghetti Dinner & Movie Thursday, September 14th at Roanoke Catholic School cafeteria. Dinner will be served from 5-7 with the movie starting around 7. This year we will be honoring the recent canonization of the Fatima children with the movie *Children of Fatima*, which tells the story of the trials and hardships the 3 children suffered after their encounter with the Blessed Virgin.

Bingo Update



After six month of

effort, our Saturday afternoon bingo at Valley Hall has resulted in a net income of about \$6,000. Since those six months included twelve sessions, that means the bingo effort raised about \$500 per session. Not bad, but this total must be divided between Roanoke and Fincastle Councils. Since Roanoke provided only 36% of the volunteers, we are entitled to only \$180 per session, or about \$2160 total.

We had hoped that the income would have been closer to the \$1,000 per session originally touted by Valley Hall, and that we would have had more volunteers to help, so that the Roanoke share would be closer to 50%.

While the income per session may improve in time, both Councils have struggled to get new volunteers. Part of that problem is that we are asking Knights and their families to give up a Saturday afternoon. We had hoped that, by having enough volunteers so that no one was asked to work more than every sixth or eighth Saturday would reduce the sacrifice to an acceptable level and even more members would volunteer. Unfortunately, that has not happened and we have actually experienced some attrition in our volunteer list. In addition, not assigning volunteers to the same Saturday each month has resulted in many conflicts with personal schedules, causing headaches for our scheduler, Louis Soldano. It also has made it difficult for volunteers to remember when they are working.

Looking forward, the bingo committee does not see any relief and in fact expects scheduling to become even more problematic as existing volunteers drop by the wayside. The committee's immediate dilemma is that we have contracted with Atlantic Bingo to offer electronic gaming during our bingo sessions. If we continue those

games, we will eventually have to pay out \$1000 prizes, which will have a major impact on our profitability. Although those prizes are built into the long term profitability of the games, we would not be able to make it back in only a couple of months.

Our contract allows us to cancel the contract within the first six months. That six month window will be closing soon. So, it makes sense to exercise our option and cancel those contracts now. The electronic gaming does increase the number of attendees at our bingo sessions. If we discontinue those games, our attendance will be reduced somewhat and make it even more difficult to net more than \$500 per session.

Considering the ongoing difficulty in scheduling enough volunteers to cover our bingo session and the likely reduction in our profits, or at least a limited growth, the bingo committee has decided to tender our letter of termination to Valley Hall and cease KC bingo in sixty days, as permitted by our agreement with Valley Hall. Since Valley Hall has worked with us during the past six months, we do want to make our transition out of bingo as least disruptive to Valley Hall as possible. That means that we may end bingo sooner than 60 days or continue to work past 60 days if needed for them to find our replacement.

August Business Meeting Highlights

- The Grand Knight announced the need for an overall program chairman. He reemphasized that one major goal for the upcoming fraternal year is to get newer and younger members more involved, and more Brother Knights involved in various activities. We need new ideas and try new activities.
- We welcomed a new transfer member, Julio Vasquez, a member at St. Andrew's.
- State football pool tickets are on sale for \$10 each. The pool starts with FL games on October 29.
- The trustees recommend transfer of \$50,000 from the scholarship fund to KofC Asset Advisor Fund, in order to provide a better return on investment.
- Expenditure of \$500 for seminarians was approved.
- Bingo is slow right now—additional volunteers are needed. We have made a profit, but not as much as anticipated.
- The Council spending plan for 2017-18 (distributed separately) was approved by the membership.
- The August Initiation (1st) Degree was cancelled and will be rescheduled.
- Montano's night for CHMRV will be held Tuesday, August 8. The annual spaghetti dinner to benefit CHMRV will be held Thursday, September 14. The movie "Children of Fatima" will be shown. A fall "fun day" is being planned for the End of October.
- The August "All Are Welcome" luncheon is scheduled for Thursday, August 17.
- Camp Easter Seals provides camping opportunities for persons with disabilities and is supported by grants from KOVAR. Brother Knights are invited to attend grant presentations to KOVAR grand recipients. KOVAR training ill be held in Roanoke Saturday, September 23.
- A new "Food for Kids" drive is being planned for October 21. Funding of \$500 was approved from funds already raised for this program.

- Planning is underway for Casino Night 2018. A chairman for this important event is needed.
- A special September Grill Night will be held Saturday, September 2 to benefit Blue Ridge Women's Shelter.
- The 2017 "Keep Christ in Christmas" campaign will be starting before long. KCIC is celebrating its 30th year this year.
