




Fr. McGivney Guild

Saint (Pope) John Paul II called the Knights of Columbus "the strong right arm of the Church." As Knights, we can all take great pride in that pronouncement! Our participation in this campaign is simple and straight-forward, to gather in prayer outside of Planned Parenthood, 2207 Peters Creek Road in Roanoke anytime between 7AM and 7PM on Thursday, October 12.
