Grand Knight's Report

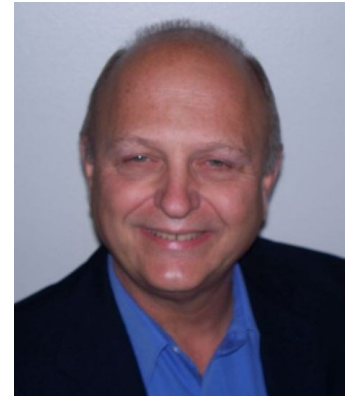
I'm sure it comes as no surprise to you that our Council has to submit various reports to Supreme every January...and other times. We have just completed the annual Fraternal Activities Report for the calendar year 2017. I thought you might find some of the information interesting.

During this last year, your Council donated **\$18,175** in charitable donations to community organizations, to our churches, for Culture of Life activities and on our Youth. The largest part of this was the \$3,500 in scholarships that we awarded to the children of our members. This was funded by the 2016 Virginia State Council Keep Christ in Christmas card sales, which we received because our Council's KCIC committee manages the State KCIC program on behalf of the State Council. Brothers Karl Kleinhenz, Bob Canfield, Dave Chopski and Randy Gatzke need to be thanked for all of their hard work running that committee!

Another large donation, \$3,262, went to the Intellectual Disabled, through the State KOVAR foundation, and directly to the special Olympics. All of this money was raised by YOU through YOUR help during the KOVAR drives, by attending the KOVAR nights at the restaurants and by helping either as a volunteer or a patron at our charity cookout at the pool.

Other significant donations included:

- \$2,472 to RAM House
- \$1,056 to VKCCI, the State run charity that helps individuals in need
- \$1,500 to three seminarians
- \$1,050 to Habitat for Humanity and Renovation Alliance

- \$1,000 to Blue Ridge Women's Center
- \$578 in purchased food and over \$500 in donated food to the needy children in Roanoke schools
- \$500 to the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts programs
- \$1,050 divided amongst Madonna House, Bradley Free Clinic, Ronald McDonald House and the Salvation Army
- \$1,250 to our three parishes

In addition to these monetary donations, we have a number of Brother Knights who spend many hours volunteering at RAM House, the Rescue Mission, Habitat for Humanity, Renovation Alliance and of course our parishes...conservatively over 3,000 hr. in 2017. So, you can be proud of what YOUR Council has and will continue to do for our community and for our churches!

A significant portion of these donations were funded from your dues and donations. But the majority of the money came from our past Casino Nights and our past bingo gaming. Though we have dissolved the bingo operation, we are hopeful that our Casino Nights can continue to be a success. YOUR support is needed!

Friday Fish Fries During Lent

We will continue to host Friday Fish Fries at the Council home this Lenten season, but will be sharing the labor with our brothers in the Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH). In this way, our Friday Fish Fries will not only be less burdensome on those Brother Knights who do volunteer to work, but hopefully increase the number of customer by eliminating the redundancy of competing, simultaneous fish fries.

The AOH will host the first, third and fifth fish fries at the Roanoke Catholic School Cafeteria on Feb. 16, March 2nd and March 16th. They will be serving baked and fried fish, sides, desserts and tea or lemonade from 5:30 to 7:00 PM. Their cost will be \$11 per adult and \$8 for those under 13 yr.

Our Friday fish fries will be on the second, fourth and sixth Fridays of Lent at our Council Home, on Feb. 23rd, Mar. 9th and Mar. 23rd. We will be serving, from 5:30 until 8:00 PM, fried beer battered cod, seasoned baked talapia, French fries, coleslaw, seasoned green beans, coffee, tea and lemonade for \$8 per adult or \$5 for those under 13 yr. Cheese pizza will also be available for \$1 per slice. Profits from our Council's fish fries will be donated to local charities.

Insurance Agent's Report

Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. At the very least, it will definitely be more expensive.
