

Grand Knight's Report

January's Columbian magazine focused on the Pro-Life March in Washington DC. It also contained some historically interesting information.

Among that was the fact that both Norma McCorvey, the woman who was identified as Jane Roe in the Roe vs Wade Supreme Court Case, and Dr. Bernard Nathanson, who co-founded the National Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws, and headed New York's Center for Reproductive

Health, the largest abortion facility in the WORLD, later repudiated the atrocities that their efforts had inflicted on the world. Both Dr. Nathanson, who was raised in the Jewish traditions but was in fact an atheist, and Norma McCorvey, who had troubled child-hood marred by drug abuse and pregnancies, later became Catholic and subsequently worked hard to undo the damage they had helped cause.

What I found of particular interest was their conviction that it was the prayers of good people around them that had saved them! While I do not pretend to know the mind of God, it seems to me that He must be very pleased when we pray for others! This should not surprise any believer, for our Lord not only told us Himself that all we had to do was "ask and you shall receive," but also said that there was no greater love than to put someone else's well being ahead of oneself.

My own personal experiences bolster my belief. For a long time I have not prayed for myself, for I have been blessed abundantly throughout my life. I know that it can't just be that my Father loves me so much that He does not allow anything untowards to happen to me. I believe that my blessings, as many as they have been, have been the result of prayers of others!

So I ask you, my Brothers, to take a few moments each day to pray for something specific for your loved ones. And while you are at it, pray for the conversion of all those working in abortion facilities. While our public demonstrations may have a temporary effect on those workers, God works at permanently changing their hearts!

Friday Fish Fries During Lent

We will continue to host Friday Fish Fries at the Council home this Lenten season, but will be sharing the labor with our brothers in the Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH). In this way, our Friday Fish Fries will not only be less burdensome on those Brother Knights who do volunteer to work, but hopefully increase the number of customer by eliminating the redundancy of competing, simultaneous fish fries.

The AOH will host fish fries at the Roanoke Catholic School Cafeteria on March 2nd and March 16th. They will be serving baked and fried fish, sides, desserts and tea or lemonade from 5:30 to 7:00 PM. Their cost will be \$11 per adult and \$8 for those under 13 yr.

Our (KofC) Friday fish fries will be on Mar. 9th and Mar. 23rd. We will be serving, from 5:30 until 8:00 PM, fried beer battered cod, seasoned baked ta-

lapia, French fries, coleslaw, seasoned green beans, coffee, tea and lemonade for \$8 per adult or \$5 for those under 13 yr. Cheese pizza will also be available for \$1 per slice. Profits from our Council's fish fries will be donated to local charities.

February Business Meeting Highlights

Grand Knight John Krumpos stressed the high priority need for help with several upcoming functions: Lenten fish fries, pancake breakfast at St. Andrew's (2/10), Casino Night (especially solicitation for door prizes)

Financial Secretary Mike Lazzuri reported that dues collection was proceeding normally, but 207 members have still not paid dues for 2018.

BK Brian Ripple thanked the council for its donation of \$300 for the Polar Plunge to support Special Olympics. The Virginia State Council collected \$55K in the event; The Knights of Columbus is the largest contributor to Special Olympics>

Casino Night planning is underway. Chairman Jim Sullivan stressed need for solicitation for prizes and donations as well as workers. This year's Casino Night Will be held June 30 at St. Elias.

The positions of recorder and warden are now open. Anyone interested should contact the Grand Knight.

Fish fries will be held on alternate Fridays in Lent, starting February 16. Help and promotion are always needed.

The Field Agent reported that Knights of Columbus annuities are currently paying 2.2%, with a quarantee of no less than 1.5% for life.

Knights of Columbus Scholarships

COUNCIL (Scholarships provided by Roanoke Council 562): Our own Roanoke 562 Council has the Albert H. Canfield Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child of a member provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death. Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community and/or church. All applications must be received by April 1st and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript (transcript does not have to be an official copy). Applications received after the cut-off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. Applications can be found on the Council's website at: http://www.kofc562.org/canfield/.

STATE (Scholarships through the Virginia State Council): The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers need-based scholarships for Knights and also their wives and widows of Knights. This award has been extended to include grandchildren of Knights. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing. Information can be found at https://vakofc.org/programs/fr-bader-scholarship/ and applications are accepted from Jan 1 – March 31.

SUPREME (Scholarships through KofC Supreme Office): There are numerous college scholarships that Supreme either funds or operates in trust. They include grants in the areas of teaching, financial need, relatives of Veterans, or attendance at a catholic college or university. They can be renewed for a total of 4 years.
